Based on the outcome of the above, we will then have to make decisions about subsequent meetings, dependant on Omicron etc etc of course! Keep safe and keep in touch



Volunteers needed to help House of Science Hawke's Bay support more schools

House of Science is a charitable trust which provides primary and intermediate schools with fun, hands-on, science resource kits. The goal is to empower teachers, because well-resourced, confident teachers deliver great science lessons, which results in engaged students.

The Hawke's Bay branch started in May 2021 with 7 member schools and 8 resource kits. Teachers love the resources, word is spreading, and we've had enquiries from many schools. We start 2022 with 17 member schools (several of whom are borrowing 2 kits a fortnight) and 28 kits. And with sponsorship of more kits confirmed, we can offer membership to more schools. We need volunteers to help us support them. To go into schools, you'll need to be double vaccinated.

A resource kit is a large 79L "fish bin", containing all the resources a teacher needs to do a range of activities. To see what a kit looks like, refer: https://houseofscience.nz/resources/.

We're looking for volunteers who are available for a couple of hours, to help with three jobs:

- On a Monday morning, collect kits from our base at Tamatea High, and deliver them to 4 or 5 schools in the Napier, Hastings or Havelock North areas. Kits need to be collected between
 9.30am and 10.30am, and delivered to schools before 12pm. This happens every second Monday during the school term, starting on 31 January. We'll reimburse your mileage for the delivery run.
- On a Wednesday afternoon, collect kits from 4 or 5 schools in the Napier, Hastings or Havelock North areas, and return them to Tamatea High. Kits need to be collected between 1pm and 2.30pm and delivered to Tamatea High between 2.45pm and 4pm. This happens every second Wednesday during the school term, starting on 9 February. We'll reimburse your mileage for the collection run.
- On a Thursday morning, come along to Tamatea High for a couple of hours between 9.15am and 1pm, to help clean and replenish the kits. This happens every second Thursday during the school term, starting on 10 February.

Whether you're available to help once a week, once a fortnight, once every 4 weeks or on an intermittent basis, we're keen to hear from you.
