A PONDER FROM OUR PRESIDENT:

Greetings to our Taradale U3A family.

Well, we were warned to expect extreme weather brought about by the effects of climate change – and it is happening. Our beautiful Hawkes Bay has been savagely attacked by rain and wind, flood and destruction. Our human vulnerability to nature's moods has been exposed yet again.



Every one of us will have been affected by Gabrielle's unwelcome visit. Some of you will have been directly affected by Gabrielle's visit – houses damaged, livelihoods threatened or swept away. Or perhaps you have been supporting family and neighbours who have suffered and are still suffering. At the very least we will all have been inconvenienced: by no electricity, no phone or internet connection, and no access to TV news and its vivid images of Gabrielle's carnage. We will all have worried about friends and neighbours and done what we could, within the limits of our strength, to support them. Many of us have been supported by others.

For any who have been seriously impacted by Gabrielle's coming: 'Kia Kaha', stay strong and stay together. I have found it sobering to reflect that though we in our house are secure, on the other side of the hills that we see from our back yard there are folk who are struggling against the elements and facing the possible loss of their homes and livelihood.

I have wondered how we who are older and who have been inconvenienced rather than damaged by Gabrielle may best contribute to the rebuilding of our community over future months and years. To date the greatest need has been for powerful machinery, youthful muscles, and technical expertise during the initial 'clean up phase'. Where do we fit in? A few suggestions may help as you respond to that simple question:

- We can continue to keep in touch with friends, family and neighbours affirming those who are doing the hard work of clean up and rebuild. We know how to encourage and support those who are struggling to put life together again. We understand the feelings of lostness, grief and anger that often follow an event like this.
- We can refuse to encourage or share in damaging, politically motivated and angry criticism
 that is already emerging, of those who did their best to support us in the aftermath of
 Gabrielle's visit. Local body leaders and agencies, the NZ government, politicians and
 departments served us very well in extraordinary circumstances and deserve our gratitude.
 We can encourage a positive attitude as together we respond to Gabrielle's nasty embrace.
- We can participate in community conversations as local and national politicians and agencies ask what we have learned from this event and how we can best prepare for similar events in the future. We have measured wisdom and experience to contribute and to share.
- Our U3A group meetings provide us with an opportunity to share our experience with Gabrielle and to receive and offer support.
- We can continue to do those simple things that make an enormous difference: sharing meals and baking, phone calls and neighbourly visits.

 Our circumstances vary and our experiences differ yet I'm sure we all have a contribution, whether large or modest, to make to the rebuilding of our shared place.

Well, that's a few thoughts that occur to me as I ponder what has been for all of us a worrying and at times stressful time. You'll have more to add.

Note the important note about the **March 6**th meeting of **'Community Affairs'** which will become an opportunity for us all to gather and reflect. See you there!
